# ChangeMakers - Community Adult Education Programme wins a National Award at the Aontas STAR Awards

Funded by Irish Aid, ChangeMakers is a development education project set up in 2012, led by IDP in partnership with Donegal ETB and Self Help Africa. ChangeMakers offers a broad range of activities to engage with adult learners, including workshops, accredited training, horticulture programmes, community arts activities, one-to-one and group mentoring. The project has been shortlisted three times for the award, before winning this year. "Denise McCool, IDPs Training and Education Officer and project Steering Group member (pictured below) attended the awards ceremony in Dublin on behalf of the project. The STAR Awards are coordinated by AONTAS, Ireland's National Learning Organisation, which acknowledges the work undertaken by adult learning groups and initiatives throughout Ireland.

ChangeMakers makes every effort to ensure the learners are at the heart of all of the project activities. Given the nature of the work, many of the ideas and topics that are covered can be challenging, as the problems the world faces can seem too global to solve at a local level. In response to this, ChangeMakers encourages participants to consider the small actions they can take for a more fair and just world, such as changing their buying habits, reducing their carbon footprint and looking at ways to reduce waste. IDP sees this award as an acknowledgement and recognition of the work with learners across the county to promote development

education and the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals through reflection, analysis and action.

The ILDN is the representative body of Local Development Companies (LDCs) in Ireland. Their stated mission is to promote and support the work of members in the areas of social inclusion and local and rural development.

The Awards took place on Friday April 5 in Farnham Estate Spa & Golf Resort in Cavan. Fourteen businesses, two from each of the seven Local Development Companies in the border region, were nominated for awards.

Fourteen entrepreneurs from all over the border region counties from the Cooley Peninsula to the Inishowen Peninsula put forward by the respective local development companies, IDP for Inishowen, rest of Donegal through Donegal Local Development Company (DLDC), Cavan through Breffni Integrated, Leitrim through Leitrim Integrated, Sligo Leader Partnership, Monaghan Integrated and Louth Leader Partnership.

Winners on the night were Paddy McDermott, Creative Landscaping; and Daniel McGrory, DMG Building Services, supported by Inishowen Development Partnership, Buncrana County Donegal and Rachael McCabe, Sound in Motion School of Music, from County Cavan supported through Breffni Integrated.

Joint CEO, Shauna McClenaghan, Inishowen Development Partnership, expressed her delight to have "both of our nominees achieve his accolade" and paid tribute to both businesses and their respective enterprise support officers, Rosemary Lyons and Sinead McDaid "who offer one to one support to start-ups" from our Buncrana IDP office.

The Back to Work Enterprise Allowance (BTWEA) scheme offered through local development companies is a Department of Employment Affairs & Social Protection (DEASP) scheme, which allows people starting a new business, who are getting certain social welfare payments to retain their payments for up to two years while self-employed.

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### **INISHOWEN SUSTAINABLE ENERGY COMMUNITY (SEC)**

IDP has been busy supporting the Community to become a Sustainable Energy Community (SEC). This is a group of people working together to develop a sustainable energy system for the benefit of the community. This is achieved by:

- · Aiming, as far as possible, to be energy efficient
- Using renewable energy where feasible
- · Adopting smart energy solutions

IDP working with Inishowen SEC have established a Community Charter and are in the process of applying for the Inishowen Energy Master Plan funding through SEAI. This will allow us to assess the current energy consumption on the peninsula amongst businesses, homes, vehicles and community buildings and the opportunities for reducing this consumption, saving on energy costs and ultimately do our part for Climate Change. The opportunities identified above can then be implemented by accessing grant funding from SEAI; Communities Energy Grant 2019. Inishowen SEC will collaborate with the public and private sectors, residential and non-residential sectors, commercial and not-for-profit organisations, financing entities and energy suppliers. Inishowen SEC will support the community to lower its carbon footprint via Building Fabric Upgrades, Technology upgrades, LED lighting, Renewable energy, Electric Vehicle charge points. In tandem with this the SEC will seek to influence behavioural change throughout the peninsula by

providing information to the community about their energy consumptions and ways to reduce it.

There are many benefits to being part of the Inishowen SEC:

- **Health** switch from diesel to electric vehicles reducing local emissions of particulates in car exhaust emissions and improving air quality. Warmer homes and buildings can also aid the health of vulnerable people in the community.
- Environmental moving away from a fossil fuel dependent local energy system is important for the environment, and helps the community become more climate change resilient for current and future generations.
- **Economic** developing employment opportunities associated with energy supply or enhanced efficiency. Energy efficient buildings are also cheaper to run.
- **Social** warmer, more comfortable buildings are more likely to be used by the community.
- **Strategic** you can position your community to avail of opportunities in current and future energy policy, local area plans and future development on a national or regional scale.

These social enterprises can be community-based projects, funded by the State to other small businesses owned by a team of entrepreneurs or can be solely owned enterprises. # Lands of Éogain Heritage Festival LEADER

Celebrating the Inishowen Peninsula's heritage to build networks, raise awareness and support cultural tourism

The Lands of Éogain heritage group was supported through LEADER funding to run the 2017 Lands of Éogain Heritage Festival. The 2017 festival had diverse aims and a wide range of local benefits. It helped to promote Inishowen as a destination for world class heritage tourism, gathering leading academics and situating Inishowen's heritage story in an international context. It raised local awareness of Inishowen's unique cultural heritage. The festival was attended by national and international participants bringing off-peak cultural tourism to the area. This also generated wider spin-off local economy benefits such as to hospitality, food service and transport providers.

The Lands of Éogain heritage group continues with its aims and activities such as collating and disseminating information on Inishowen heritage, providing training opportunities, as well as running projects and seminars. The group has been involved in digs and research, such as at the Cooley Graveyard monastic settlement in the Moville area. The group recognises that local heritage has its own important innate value, but also if carefully managed and harnessed is a significant resource that can support economic development through supporting local cultural heritage tourism.

Lands of Éogain first held a heritage festival in 2015 aiming to share the results of excavations carried out in collaboration with the Bernician Studies Group.

LEADER funding supported the 2017 Lands of Éogain Heritage Festival which acted as a focal point to celebrate Inishowen heritage, attract tourism to the area and build future momentum. A festival concept for 2017 was developed aiming to provide academic and historical information in an accessible and informative way. In the wider context, the festival supported the goals of the Donegal Local Development Strategy. One of its objectives is to harness the potential of Donegal's world class authentic tourism offerings for the benefit of rural communities by facilitating diversification and the creation of indigenous tourism enterprises, community based tourism initiatives and ancillary facilities. The Lands of Éogain Heritage Festival directly supports this goal as a community based festival supporting cultural heritage tourism and education. The festival was planned for September to stimulate tourism at an off-peak time of year.

IDP is the CE Sponsoring Body for the Childcare CE Scheme across the Inishowen Peninsula with 25 participants based in 13 Community Childcare Settings. Through this programme, participants are offered progression opportunities in ECCE training and hands on work experience within the sector. They

undertake QQI Level 5 and 6 Training. Here is what one of our participants has to say about her experience – "Before I started the scheme, my opinion of the CE Scheme was that Social Welfare was just there to take people off Welfare, I didn't realise that the scheme actually found meaningful Jobs for people and helped educate them while they were on the CE Scheme.



I've completed my Level 5 in Early Childhood Care and Education and with the ongoing support from the Inishowen Development Partnership I can now do a Degree in Childcare, when my training is up I will have the confidence to go out and find a job.

My whole family has benefited as a result of the CE Scheme and the support received from the Inishowen Development Partnership.

# **FAIRTRADE**

Several events took place across the peninsula to raise awareness and encourage the Inishowen community to buy Fairtrade products. Many of the schools, both primary and second level, have led the way in showing the importance of Fairtrade and how we as consumers can make a difference. This year's theme was "Create fairtrade" and it also linked in with the Sustainable Development Goals. Carndonagh held its event in Colgan Hall as a whole community event with local producers, schools and the community coming together to celebrate Fairtrade fortnight.

Stalls included local community and schools, as well as local producers and artisans. Donagh National School provided a short musical performance during the morning. A tasty lunch was provided by Feras & Asmaa, a selection of food from their Syrian cuisine. The crowd loved the food and enjoyed fairtrade tea and coffee from Banba Café on site for the morning. Students from Moville Community College also called in to the Fair, they had been out at Clonmany NS with their teacher Colleen Cooney to speak to the students on Fairtrade. Inishowen schools have been leading the way

in awareness raising for Fairtrade. It is hoped at some point that Inishowen can become a Fairtade peninsula. We are pleased also to have the support of the local businesses, youth and community sector and schools along with the Council in promoting this work in the town. It was great to have members of the community coming out to celebrate and show support for Fairtrade and farmers. "We can make a difference by the choices we make" says Denise McCool, a member of Fairtrade Carndonagh, and staff member of IDP who is supporting this work as part of the Changemakers programme.







# WISH Women's Intercultural Support Hub

The WISH project has come together for women who have moved to Inishowen as an opportunity for social activities, creative outlets and craft workshops, day trips, and to identify possible courses migrant women might like to do to gain new skills. The WISH project is supported by Communities Integration Fund through the Department of Justice & Equality. Two activities have taken place during February with more to be planned. The women had a workshop entitled Journey's and Connected Space at the Anglers Centre in Buncrana. It began with a short presentation led by artist Bernadette Hopkins on how women have visually documented experiences and ideas through textiles. This includes a look at the 'Arpilera' collage work by women from Chile using cloth and also textile maps and collage that trace personal journey's. The second session which was 'Accouscenic Listening', was a

process to pinpoint sound in the landscape and create a sound map of the place we are in. It adds to a sense of place, our own imagination and often reminds us of other places. This workshop was an enjoyable way to experience the landscape around us and experience mindfulness. This part of the workshop was again led by Bernadette. The women got to visit a few locations as part of the day finishing off with lunch at the Fair & Local country market/lunch event in Carndonagh, which also coincided with International Women's day. Local artist Marie Barrett brought cameras on this trip for women to use. The group also got to stop off for coffee at Crafty Anne's, followed by a walk on Ballyliffin beach and then on to the Carndonagh event. This group is open and others are welcome to join at any time. # Training MEDLIT

# QQI LEVEL 4 FOOD SAFETY INCORPORATING HACCP

This is an FSPA (Food Safety Professionals Association) course leading to a QQI Level 4 Certificate in Food Safety incorporating HACCP.

This course is designed to appeal to a broad range of food workers and individuals with an interest in food safety. It will be run over 2 full days and will have an assessment at the end. The assessment is broken into two parts: a written examination and a skills test.

This course is particularly aimed at food handlers, catering staff who prepare food for public consumption, staff who serve in hotels, hospitals, nursing homes, retail outlets and general catering establishments. Also non food handlers who can affect the safety of food.

- Hygiene & Safety
- Food Contamination
- · Cleaning & Pest control
- · Legal standards for Food Handlers
- Design & layout of food premises

- 1. The Development and Co-ordination of our Cross Community Empathy and Good Relations Programme for Young People. (GREAT)
- 2. Youth Diversity and Citizenship Training Project-BORDER BRIDGES.

The funding has been secured from Donegal County Council as Lead Partner on behalf of the County Donegal Peace IV Partnership. The projects will see the promotion of positive relations characterised by respect and where cultural diversity is celebrated and people can live, learn and socialise together, free from prejudice, hate and intolerance. Activities under the wider PEACE IV programme will focus on developing strong inclusive civic leadership that promotes positive relationships, encourages dialogue, and supports practical efforts to bring about change between individuals and communities. Initiatives will be tackling real and complex issues, such as sectarianism and racism in border regions. These projects have been supported by the EU's PEACE IV Programme, managed by the Special EU Programme Body (SEUPB).









# **Primary Schools Lego**

# Parents Plus - Early Years Programme

Inishowen Development Partnership hosted a very successful "Parents Plus Early Years Programme" targeting parents of children of pre-school age. The programme ran from February 5th to April 2nd, 2019. A total of 13 parents contributed greatly to the discussions and participated fully. The training was delivered by Jacqueline Doherty of Foroige and John Jackson IDP and the main themes covered were the familiar messages of the Parents Plus Programme including, active listening, pausing, positive discipline, encouragement, communication and parental self-care. The group was asked to set personal goals for the programme and the members were encouraged to make those goals as specific and realistic as possible. At the end of the programme the participants looked at the goals they had set at the beginning and checked to see how much closer they now were to achieving them.



Group members reported that both parents and children were now calmer and that new positive routines were established. The evaluation of the programme was most positive with a high level of satisfaction expressed with both the content and the delivery of the course.
